## **Executive Summary**

Following the summer 2015 Highland Cove Subdivision hearings, ACHD staff was directed to work with the Highlands neighborhood through a public process to assess and recommend various mitigation measures to improve the safety for all modes of travel in the greater Highlands area. This report summarizes this effort and makes recommendations for implementation of improvements.

June 24, 2015	ACHD Commission heard testimony for Highlands Cove Subdivision preliminary plat application; deferred decision to August 5 for staff to collaborate with neighborhood and developer on possible mitigation to address traffic and safety concerns
August 5, 2015	Staff reported on possible mitigation measures; Commission approved application; put mitigation measures on hold pending Boise City Council action on application
December 1, 2015	Boise City Council approved preliminary plat application
February 10, 2016	Staff held work session with Commission to examine possible mitigation measures prior to holding a public open house meeting
April 6, 2016	ACHD held public open house meeting, gathered input directly and through a survey
June 15, 2016	Commission approved interim stop signs at five locations prior to developer beginning construction
April-July 2016	Staff worked with neighborhood representatives to refine mitigation measures

#### **Highland View Drive**

Stop signs at Selkirk and Whidden (during construction as pilot first)	\$500	Installed July 2016
Extruded curb protected walking path, northerly side, Braemere to 900' east of Selkirk (existing sidewalk). Eliminates parking on northerly side.	\$50,000 (3700')	By Spring 2017; potential partial pilot in 2016?
Crosswalks at several locations (demand verified)	\$2,500	By Spring 2017

Eliminated from consideration:

- o Seed humps (unsupported)
- Street lighting (unsupported light pollution)
- Bus stops (can use protected path area)

#### Upper Braemere (northeasterly of Curling)

Stop signs at Balmoral and Chardie/Harcourt (during construction as pilot first)	\$500	Installed July 2016
Radar speed sign (alternate locations annually with Highland View Drive)	\$5,000	Fall 2016
Crosswalks at several locations (demand verified)	\$2,500	By Spring 2017

Eliminated from consideration:

- Speed humps (unsupported)
- Medians (try stop signs first)
- Chicanes (hard to retrofit/lost parking)
