NEIGHBORHOOD CHIPPING PROGRAM

GETTING STARTED

Interested in having a woodchipper brought to your area? Use the guidelines below to see if you qualify.

- Your neighborhood must be within City of Boise limits and at risk of wildfire.
- Participants must first receive a Wildfire Home Safely Evaluation provided at no cost by the Boise Fire Department.
- A minimum of five addresses is required per neighborhood for chipper deployment.
- Chipping occurs on predetermined Fridays.

Please share your interest share your interest in the Neighborhood Chipping Program with your neighbors to ensure that you have enough addresses.

WHAT'S ACCEPTED

- Piles of wood limbs and branches, up to 9 inches in diameter only.
- · No construction or building material.
- No trash, weeds, or other yard debris.
- · No root wads, dirt, or rocks.
- No grass clippings.
- · No bags of leaves or pine needles.
- Piles must be clear of nails, wire, and all metal.

PILE GUIDELINES

- Piles must be stacked curbside by 8 am Friday morning and will be picked up by end of day.
- Piles must be stacked neatly with ends facing the road.
- Piles must be within 5 feet of the roadway.
- Limit pile size to 5 feet x 5 feet x 5 feet . There is no limit as to the number of piles along the curb.
- Do not combine piles with your neighbors or haul in from other neighborhoods.
- Do not tie or band piles.
- Material that does not fit these guidelines will not be picked up.
